Key facts

- National parks protect special natural and cultural places.
- Kakadu, in the north, is famous for wildlife and ancient Aboriginal rock art.
- Parks protect plants, animals and habitats.
- Many are looked after together with Traditional Owners.

Key vocabulary

- Habitat — where a plant or animal lives.
- Rock art — ancient paintings on rock.

Some parks, like Kakadu, are managed jointly with Aboriginal Traditional Owners, combining modern and traditional knowledge.
