History Quiz Path

Board game — Romans, Vikings, Egyptians, Tudors

How to play

Rules for 2–4 players

- Players: 2–4
- You need: 1 die, counters, question cards (4 colour-coded sets)
- Board has 4 colour-coded sections — one per history topic.
- On your turn, move to the next coloured section and draw a question card from that set.
- Answer correctly → stay on the square. Wrong → go back one space.
- Bonus squares: 'TIME PORTAL — move forward 3 spaces'. Danger squares: 'PLAGUE — miss a turn'.
- First to reach the end castle wins.

Sample question cards — Romans

- Who was the Roman general who first invaded Britain in 55 BC? (Julius Caesar)
- What did the Romans call their foot soldiers? (Legionaries)
- What was a Roman bath house called? (Thermae or Balneum)
- What do we call the road building technique that made Roman roads last 2,000 years?
(Cambered surface with layers of rubble and stone)



- Name one thing the Romans brought to Britain. (roads / underfloor heating / concrete / calendar)

Sample question cards — Ancient Egypt

- What were the rulers of ancient Egypt called? (Pharaohs)
- What was the purpose of the pyramids? (tombs for pharaohs)
- What was the process of preserving a dead body called? (Mummification)
- Name the Egyptian god of the afterlife. (Osiris — or Anubis, god of death)
- What did ancient Egyptians use to write on? (papyrus)
