Key facts

- Canada's far north reaches into the Arctic Circle.
- It is cold, treeless tundra, frozen for much of the year.
- Nunavut, created in 1999, is a large northern territory with a mostly Inuit population.
- In summer the sun barely sets; in winter it barely rises.

- Tundra — frozen, treeless land.
- Territory — a northern region governed federally.
- Permafrost — ground that stays frozen all year.
