Key facts

- Canada has four clear seasons, with big differences between them.
- Winters can be very cold and snowy, especially in the north and centre.
- Summers can be warm and sunny.
- Autumn brings brilliant red and orange leaves, especially on maple trees.

- Frost — frozen dew on cold mornings.
