The ten provinces

- British Columbia (Victoria)
- Alberta (Edmonton)
- Saskatchewan (Regina)
- Manitoba (Winnipeg)
- Ontario (Toronto)
- Quebec (Quebec City)
- New Brunswick (Fredericton)
- Nova Scotia (Halifax)
- Prince Edward Island (Charlottetown)
- Newfoundland and Labrador (St. John's)

The three territories

- Yukon (Whitehorse)
- Northwest Territories (Yellowknife)
- Nunavut (Iqaluit) — Canada's newest territory, created in 1999, with a large Inuit population

Key vocabulary

- Province — a region with its own government.
- Territory — a northern region governed more directly by the national government.
- Capital city — where a government is based; Canada's national capital is Ottawa.
- Bilingual — Canada has two official languages, English and French.

Did you know?

Canada is the second-largest country in the world by area, yet most people live in a narrow band near the southern border. Ottawa is the national capital — not Toronto or Montreal.
