## Key facts

- Canada's far north is Arctic — freezing, treeless and snow-covered for much of the year.
- The Inuit are the Indigenous peoples of this region, with thousands of years of survival knowledge.
- Arctic animals include polar bears, Arctic foxes, seals and caribou.
- In summer the sun barely sets; in winter it barely rises.

## Key vocabulary

- Arctic — the cold region around the North Pole.
- Tundra — frozen, treeless land.
- Inuit — the Indigenous peoples of the Arctic.
- Midnight sun — when the sun stays up through the night in summer.

## Inuit knowledge

For thousands of years, Inuit peoples have thrived in one of Earth's harshest places — hunting, making warm clothing from animal skins, and reading the land, ice and weather with deep skill. Today Inuit culture remains strong, especially in Nunavut.

## A changing Arctic

The Arctic is warming faster than almost anywhere on Earth, melting ice and affecting both wildlife and the Inuit way of life.
