Exit Tickets

Six 60-second formats

Pick the format that fits the lesson

<p>1 — 3-2-1</p> <p>On a sticky note: 3 things you learned, 2 things you found interesting, 1 thing you still want to know.</p>	<p>2 — Traffic light</p> <p>Color one circle: GREEN (I get it!), AMBER (mostly), RED (I'm lost). Ask follow-up to red & amber students next lesson.</p>
<p>3 — Show me</p> <p>Solve one problem from today's lesson. If they can do it, you taught it.</p>	<p>4 — Tweet it</p> <p>Sum up today's lesson in 140 characters or fewer. Tests precision.</p>
<p>5 — Question of the day</p> <p>Write a question you wish you could ask a friend / parent / scientist about what we did.</p>	<p>6 — Picture it</p> <p>Draw a tiny diagram or sketch that captures today's main idea. No words allowed.</p>

Why exit tickets work

They take 60 seconds. They give you data on every child, not just the ones who put their hand up. You can sort the answers in 90 seconds, see the misconceptions, and plan tomorrow's starter accordingly. Most teachers who try them for two weeks never go back.
