Punctuation Basics

Capital letters, full stops, question marks, exclamation marks

The four basics

Capital letter (A): used at the start of every sentence, and for names. Full stop (.): used at the end of a statement. Question mark (?): used at the end of a question. Exclamation mark (!): used at the end of an exclamation, surprise or strong feeling. Every sentence must start with a capital and end with one of these three marks.
