Week 4 — Our Local Heroes

How to adapt this assembly

This template celebrates local community helpers. Pick 2-3 local people or groups to highlight — firefighters, crossing guards, shop workers, bus drivers, volunteers, NHS workers, etc. Make it specific to your community.

Slide 1 — Opening

Good morning! Today we're going to talk about HEROES. Not superheroes from movies, but real heroes who live and work right here in [your town/area]. These people help make our community a great place to live.

Slide 2 — Hero 1 [Customize]

First, let's think about [firefighters/crossing guards/bus drivers]. Every day, they [specific thing they do for your community]. When [specific example], they [how they helped]. Who has seen [this person/these people] helping?

Slide 3 — Hero 2 [Customize]

Next, let's think about [shop workers/teachers/volunteers]. They help us by [specific examples]. Even when [challenge they face], they keep [how they help]. That's what heroes do — they keep helping others.

Slide 4 — How can we say thank you?

Our heroes don't help us to get thanked, but it's nice to show we notice. We can say thank you, wave when we see them, follow the rules that make their job easier, or even write thank-you cards.



Slide 5 — You can be a hero too

Today's big idea: You can be a hero for other people. Helping your classmates, being kind to family, tidying up without being asked — small acts of help make you a hero to someone else.

Customization tips

Make this assembly local and specific. Use real examples if possible ('Mr. Ahmed at the corner shop always smiles and helps families find what they need'). Consider inviting a local hero to visit your class if school policy allows.
